ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT OF INDIA, SHRI RAM NATH KOVIND ON THE OCCASION OF CALL ON BY THE PROBATIONERS OF DIFFERENT RAILWAY SERVICES

- 1. I welcome you all to Rashtrapati Bhavan and congratulate you for your selection to the prestigious Railway Services. Your selection to the prestigious services marks a big personal milestone for each one of you and your families must be proud of you. While you celebrate your success, do not lose sight of the bigger goals and responsibilities that lie ahead for each one of you. All of you in your own ways will get an opportunity to contribute to Indian Railways and serve millions of Indians each day.
- 2. You are from different Group 'A' services. Some of you are from the Civil Services and some from the Engineering Services. These different services in the Indian Railways are like different colours of a rainbow. Think of yourself as a key player of 'Team Railways'.
